Paradise Island, Bahamas – This January, sports and entertainment celebrities came together for the 5th Annual Michael Jordan Celebrity Invitational at the One & Only Ocean Club on Paradise Island. And, in a manner of speaking, Hole In One International was there. Spearfish, S.D. – Last August there was something "fishy" going on in South Dakota. To raise funds for the High Plains Western Heritage Center and



the Spearfish Visitors and Convention Bureau (VCB), the Bureau, in conjunction with KEVN Fox 7 in Rapid City, held The Second Annual Big Fish Race.

In this creative twist on a traditional duck race, the VCB sold "fish" sponsorships, giving participants the chance to take home a \$50,000 prize, which would be split 50/50 with the VCB and paid for by Odds On Promotions, Hole in One International's sister company. Prior to the race, Odds On preselected four "lucky fish" from all of the fish that had been sold. However, Lutnes didn't leave the top finishers to flounder; a total of \$875 was awarded to the top three finishers in auxiliary prizes.
